The Feast of the Hunters Moon occurred last month just outside West Lafayette, Indiana at Fort Ouiatenon. This event is a recreation of life at this 18th century French fort. Several troops from our district and troops from the Sagamore Council were among the 7000 costumed volunteers. These troops either operated food booths or did trash clean up. Both are great ways to raise money for a troop. The troops from our district were 318, 326, 337, 338, 359, 370, and 431. Members of other troops and packs came as visitors or worked in booths operated by non-scouting organizations. In recent years I have seen troops from Illinois, Michigan, and Ohio also participating. The Feast is a great event and in its 46 years has always had a strong BSA representation. Requirements for some

representation. Requirements for some merit badges can be meet at this event and many demonstrators are scouters willing help scouts learn about the history or their craft.
