The Feast is a re-creation of the annual fall gathering of the French and Native Americans which took place Fort Ouiatenon, a furtrading outpost in the mid-1700s. It is held annually in early autumn on the banks of the Wabash River, four miles southwest of West Lafayette, Indiana.

Thousands of participants re-enact this event creating a feast for your senses. Smell the wood smoke, hear the report of the rifles, savor authentic food and more. The Troop sells food as a fundraiser to help support the many scouting events and activities planned for the year.

### **Good Turn for Goodwill**


**INDIANAPOLIS** – Central Indiana residents with clothes, toys, housewares or other items to donate can count on an assist from their local Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, who are collecting donations for Goodwill this fall.

From October 12 to November 15, participants from Crossroads of America Council, BSA and Girl Scouts of Central Indiana will collect items and bring them to any of Goodwill's more than 50 stores and donation centers. Last year, about 3,000 Scouts participated, collecting about 44,000 pounds of donations. The Good Turn for Goodwill service project was inspired by Boy Scout Troop 199 of Fishers, which first held a Goodwill donation drive in 2011.

Blue print shows required knots, apparatus design and instructions for:

Bowline

Clove hitch

Overhand

Round Turn with two half hitches

Sheepshank

Sheet bend

Slip knot

Square bow knot

The New Year will see the Klondike Derby in February, the district dinner and Pinewood Derby in March, and the Cub Olympics and Spring Camporee in April.

Finally, thank you to Tom James for serving as our district executive for two and a half years. Good luck in your new position in Ohio. You will be missed.
