The online recharter system is now live! All unit leaders and committee chairs should have received an email in the last week of September with their unit's access code. The District Commissioner, William Turner (wjturner@nesa.org), also has the access codes for all the units if someone still needs it.

Every unit should access the online system as soon as possible to ensure they know how to interact with the system. The unit should designate one person to do this and serve as the charter renewal processor for the unit. Please forward that person's name, email address, and phone number(s) to our Senior District Executive, Tom James (tjames@crossroadsbsa.org), so we can include this person on any future charter-related communications.

The unit will need to submit its completed charter renewal packet at one of the charter renewal submission opportunities listed below. This year we will assign each unit a 15-minute window to submit its packet at one of the opportunities in each county, which we hope will make the entire process go much more smoothly.
